

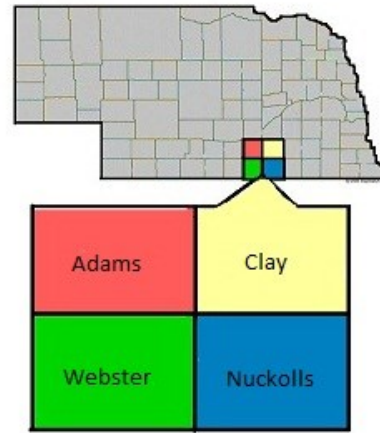

Here are just a few examples of the services provided to your community:

305 residents were provided with current, easily accessible information for individuals and families who were dealing with substance abuse and recovery issues through ASAAP's Lending Library

8 children were provided child care in a safe and educational environment by the Child Development Council (Pooh Corner)

10 individuals participated in adult education programs with Hastings Literacy Program

15 residents received support with personal finances, Homeless Prevention Assistance, free income tax preparation, food bank savings, weatherization and transportation through Community Action of Mid-Nebraska's Homeless Prevention Program

42 families received home parenting assistance through Healthy Beginnings

25 individuals received education to after they completed an intensive treatment program at Horizon Recovery and Counseling Center

6 family caregivers gained the tools, knowledge and confidence they need to continue caring for a loved with special needs right in their own home by Hastings Respite Care

1360 individuals received Family Support services from Catholic Social Services in the form of Emergency assistance needing food, clothing, furniture, medicine and/or help with rent or utilities

22 individuals received support, guidance, and education through the SASA Center for a life free of domestic and sexual violence

12 children were matched one-on-one with positive adult role models who are their friends and mentors through Big Brothers Big Sisters

9 children were provided trained, court appointed, community volunteers to advocate for them through CASA of South Central Nebraska

281 individuals received services from Y.W.C.A of Adams County
